

DIY Tree Skirt Sewing Instructions

Step 1: Take butcher paper and a pencil with string tied to it and make 1/4 of a circle 24" x 24"




Step 2: Cut the 1/4 of a circle out and fold in half on the dotted line and cut in half along dotted line.




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Step 3: Measure 3" from the short end and cut off the tip.




Step 4: Place your cut out paper on the fabric and trace out so your cut out. Repeat step with muslin backing.



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Step 5: Stitch 7 seams piece together leaving one seam open so it's able to wrap around the tree - see photo below.



Step 6: Lay out your muslin fabric and size/fit to the back of the tree skirt. Remember to leave one seam not stitched.

Step 7: Finish the raw outside edges by folding to the underside and stitching.

**Optional: Take scrap fabric and add 3 loops to one seam and add 3 ties to the other seam
